Mount Vernon High School Expands their Implementation of the CAASS System into Their New High School

Newly Opened Nellie A. Thornton High School to goes Live with CAASS; with a Focus on Access Control

Students will also be required to scan their identification card when entering the cafeteria to verify they are scheduled for lunch during that period. CAASS will also print tardy passes for those students which enter school after their designated late time.
